Meloni Warns NATO of Threats from Russia and China in Africa

Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni warned fellow NATO leaders not to lose sight of potential threats off the alliance's southern flank, as most attention is being focused to the east. In a Wednesday meeting in Washington, the Italian premier produced a map that showed Russian and Chinese influence in Africa, according to people familiar with the matter. Meloni drew attention to the fact that Russia and China are increasingly present in Africa — which is on the European Union's southern doorstep — and she said that the North Atlantic Treaty Organization can't afford to remain indifferent to the challenges and opportunities on the continent, one of the people said. A spokesperson from the Italian government didn't immediately reply to requests for comment. The US State Department has accused Moscow and Beijing before of running disinformation campaigns in Africa aimed at undermining the west in the so-called global south. Other concerns, include Russia weaponizing migration flows, which have fueled anti-immigration sentiment in Europe, and driving political instability in the Sahel region. Mint.

China is willing to work together with African countries to gather strength in order to accelerate the implementation of the United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and promote the development and revitalization of the African continent, Wang added. China-Guinea-Bissau partnership yields tangible benefits, empowers local fisheries

In Bissau, the capital of Guinea-Bissau, early mornings are marked by the return of fishing boats laden with catches to the Alto Bandim Fishing Port. "Thanks to this fishing port built by China, our work at sea has become easier, and we earn more than before," a fisherman told Xinhua. Beyond the fishery sector, China-Guinea-Bissau cooperation under the framework of the Belt and Road Initiative has extended to infrastructure, healthcare, agriculture and other fields, yielding tangible benefits and largely contributing to the Western African country's development. The friendship between both countries reached a new milestone on Wednesday when Chinese President Xi Jinping and Guinea-Bissau President Umaro Sissoco Embalo decided to elevate bilateral relations to a strategic partnership during their meeting in Beijing. Situated on the west coast of Africa, Guinea-Bissau has rich fishery resources. The completion of the China-supported Alto Bandim Fishing Port project in May 2023 has greatly enhanced the utilization of local resources, remarkably boosting development. Xinhua.

How risky is Guinea-Bissau's China dependence?

Guinea-Bissau's overreliance on China is immense. Hardly any investment occurs without Chinese planning or financing. Some observers consider this problematic. "The influence of China on Guinea-Bissau is undeniable, especially in economic terms," Bissau-Guinean sociologist and China expert, Diamantino Lopes, said in an interview with DW. Since the country's independence from Portugal five decades ago, almost all infrastructure measures have been carried out and financed by the Chinese, the analyst added. "The government palace, the justice building, the parliament, the renovation of the Palace of the Republic, the 13-kilometer (8-mile) highway between the airport and Safim, the national stadium in Bissau, or the new fishing port in Bandim — the Chinese control almost everything here," Lopes explained. This week, Guinea-Bissau's President Umaro Sissoco Embalo is in China with a high-ranking delegation. During the three-day visit, cooperation between the two countries is expected to be "further developed and intensified." DW.
