Guinea-Bissau and China sign a strategic partnership agreement

China and Guinea-Bissau have elevated their ties into a strategic partnership. The deal was made during a three-day visit to Beijing by President Umaro Sissoco Embaló of Guinea-Bissau and comes in the wake of new Chinese projects and investments in the West African nation. The upgraded ties come after years of deepening relations, now in their 50th year. President Xi Jinping stressed that China was ready to strengthen exchanges at all levels, especially in areas like governance, agriculture, mining, infrastructure construction and the blue economy. Xi also called on Chinese enterprises to invest in Guinea-Bissau, helping the country to realise its resource potential. Speaking at Osvaldo Vieira International Airport in Bissau before his trip, Sissoco Embaló said that China had committed a further US\$27.5 million to Guinea-Bissau to be allocated to new projects. As crises hit plagued Niger-Benin oil pipeline, it may be up to China to end the deadlock

After pumping billions into Niger's oil industry, a political crisis could scupper any chance for China to see a return on its investment. With the taps turned off on a Chinese-funded oil pipeline from Niger to Benin, China has found itself in the middle of negotiations to solve the internal crises that are plaguing relations between the two West African nations. China pumped billions of dollars into the building of the 2,000km (1,243-mile) Niger-Benin oil pipeline, running from the Agadem oilfield to Benin's Atlantic coast. China was betting on the export of the oil to recoup that money – as well as a US\$400 million loan that China advanced to Niger in April that was to be repaid through oil shipments. China's JCHX to invest \$300m in Zambia's Lubambe Copper Mine

China's JCHX Mining is reportedly planning to invest \$300m (2.18bn yuan) investment in the Lubambe Copper Mine in Zambia, Reuters reported. The move is aimed at reviving the mine, which was recently acquired by JCHX

from EMR Capital, and extending its operational life. JCHX Mining, a Shanghai-listed mining services and contracting company, holds an 80% stake in the mine, while the remaining 20% is owned by Zambia's state mining investment arm, ZCCM Investments Holdings (ZCCM-IH). ZCCM-IH has expressed its intention to negotiate a new shareholders agreement and commercial terms with JCHX. Located in the Copperbelt Province of Zambia, the Lubambe Copper Mine is an underground operation that began in 2012. Mining Technology.

Guinea-Bissau willing to further consolidate relations, cooperation with China

Guinea-Bissau has been forging ahead shoulder to shoulder with China and will continue to strengthen relations and cooperation with China for better development, said the president of the Republic of Guinea-Bissau.
