The call came during a phone discussion between Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi and his Egyptian counterpart, Badr Abdelatty, on Saturday, according to a report by the South China Morning Post. China's first ever defence attaché to Niger, Colonel-Major Chen Xuming, was welcomed earlier this month at a reception held at the Chinese embassy in the capital Niamey.

In front of Chinese ambassador Jiang Feng, and top Nigerien military chiefs including Sani Kache, secretary general of the defence ministry, Chen said he was ready to work with the West African country to implement the Global Security Initiative – China's framework for international cooperation on security issues – "to expand and deepen cooperation between the two militaries". China to Hand Over Full Control of Kenya Railway at the End of the Year

The Kenya Railways Corporation (KRC) will take full operating control of the Standard Gauge Railway in December 2025, six months past the original deadline, from a Chinese state-owned firm that currently runs the line. It was always part of the plan for the Chinese to hand over operations of the 592km railway once KRC staff were fully trained to handle maintenance, security, and other services. Sudan's RSF, allies sign 'unity govt' deal

Sudan's paramilitary Rapid Support Forces, or RSF, and its allies signed a charter on Sunday to establish a unity government in the conflict-hit country. The charter was sealed behind a closed-door event in Nairobi, the capital of Kenya, despite protests from Sudan's Transitional Sovereign Council, led by Abdel Fattah al-Burhan that such a move could further destabilize the country. The move by the signatories, including prominent rebel leader Abdelaziz al-Hilu, paved the way for establishing the Sudan Founding Alliance, which aims to promote peace and unity in rebel-controlled areas of Sudan. China Daily.

Chinese peacekeeping infantry battalion to South Sudan (Juba) completes command post exercise

Recently, the 11th Chinese Peacekeeping Infantry Battalion to the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS), in collaboration with the UNMISS Sector Juba, carried out the operational wargaming and casualty evacuation drills focusing on the UN House security and defense, accommodation of displaced civilian, and armed escort missions. After the UNMISS Sector Juba issued a simulated alert to upgrade the security situation to yellow level, the Chinese Peacekeeping Infantry Battalion immediately activated its emergency plan and made detailed operational schemes such as force composition, operational routes, operational coordination and logistics support.
