[Morocco acquires 001K “Scorpion” drone from China](#)

Morocco has acquired Chinese-made TB-001K “Scorpion” reconnaissance and attack drones as part of ongoing efforts to modernize its defense capabilities and strengthen ties with Beijing. Developed by Sichuan Tengden Sci-Tech Innovation Co., the unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) features dual engines and a twin-tail design, significantly enhancing its maneuverability. The drone also boasts an impressive operational range of up to 6,000 kilometers (3,728 miles) and can remain airborne for up to 35 hours. Military Africa.

Two Chinese companies have been tapped by Morocco to join a group of international investors in building green hydrogen projects worth 319 billion Moroccan dirhams (about \$32.7 billion), signaling another milestone in green cooperation between the two countries. The Moroccan government last week approved six projects that it said are to be developed in three southern provinces, with each project allocated up to 30,000 hectares. The projects, aiming to produce ammonia, steel and industrial fuel, are part of Morocco's broader push for green energy transition. CGTN.

Chinese users turn to off-exchange Congolese copper to ease supply tightness

China will import even more off-exchange refined copper this year, according to analysts and traders, as output from the Congo booms and users look to alleviate shortages and head off a potential disruption to supplies of U.S. scrap. The expected surge illustrates the growing reliance of China, the world's biggest copper user, on refined metal supply from the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), now the world's second-largest copper producer after years of massive Chinese mining investment there.
