### U.S. airstrikes targeted ISIS militants in Somalia, AFRICOM confirms

U.S. Africa Command (AFRICOM) confirmed that airstrikes on March 25, 2025, killed several ISIS-Somalia operatives in northern Somalia, near the Golis Mountains. The operation was conducted in coordination with the Somali government. No civilian casualties were reported, according to AFRICOM. The strike is part of efforts by U.S. and Somali forces to counter the growing threat of ISIS-Somalia, a group that has expanded its presence in the region in recent years. Initially formed by defectors from the al-Qaida-aligned Al-Shabaab, ISIS-Somalia now has an estimated 1,000 members, up from approximately 300 in 2019. Hiiraan.

### Somalia: U.S. Military Target Islamic State With Airstrikes in Puntland, Somalia

The United States Military launched airstrikes against Islamic State (IS) militants in northern Somalia at the request of the federal government, intensifying efforts to counter the group's expanding influence in the Bari region. The U.S. Africa Command (AFRICOM) operation hit "known IS hideouts" in the Golis mountains of the semi-autonomous Puntland region late Tuesday, according to a Mogadishu statement. Initial reports suggest "multiple IS fighters" were killed, with no civilian casualties noted, though further details remain undisclosed. Despite its smaller presence in Somalia compared to Al-Qaeda-linked Al-Shabaab, IS has sparked growing alarm among security experts due to its rising activity in the East African country. #### Somalia receives military equipment from African Union ahead of AUSSOM deployment

Somali government has received a significant shipment of military equipment from the African Union to enhance the country's security infrastructure and support ongoing efforts to stabilize the region. The consignment includes armored vehicles, helmets and vests, an armored personnel carrier, fuel and water tankers, engines, medical supplies, and other essential resources. Somali Ambassador to Ethiopia and Permanent Representative to the AU, H.E. Amb. Abdullahi Mohamed Warfa received the equipment during a handover event with the AU Continental Logistics Base (CLB) team in Douala, Cameroon. Hiiraan.
