South African import probes targeting China prompt call for free-trade zone

Study finds more than 17 per cent of South Africa's anti-dumping measures aimed at Beijing, with Chinese steel products the biggest targets. China and South Africa should establish a free-trade zone "as soon as possible", a Renmin University academic has suggested as Beijing has been the top target of the country's anti-dumping actions. In an article published on Wednesday, Song Lifang, vice-president of the university's Belt and Road Economic Research Institute, suggested that Beijing set up an economic integration organisation in the region to counter anti-dumping measures. Despite being South Africa's biggest trade partner, Beijing faced 44 anti-dumping investigations and 25 anti-dumping measures from its fellow Brics member between 1995 and 2021, according to Song, referring to data from the World Trade Organization and China's Ministry of Commerce. The action accounts for 17.53 of South Africa's anti-dumping investigations and 17.36 per cent of its anti-dumping measures in the 26-year period. In comparison, South Africa launched 23 anti-dumping investigations against India, 16 against South Korea and 13 against Taipei in the same period. South China Morning Post.

Egypt and China emphasise investment and trade in bilateral relations

Egypt seeks to strengthen its economic ties with China, emphasising investment and trade. This was announced by Minister of Investment and Foreign Trade of Egypt Hassan El-Khatib during a meeting with members of the Egyptian-Chinese Business Council on Monday, reported by Daily News Egypt, a partner of TV BRICS. El-Khatib noted that boosting investment for exports is a key element of the country's economic policies and emphasised the importance of coordination among government institutions to increase merchandise exports. Joint military exercise between China, Mozambique and Tanzania underway

The Chinese, Mozambican and Tanzanian militaries are currently holding the Peace Unity 2024 joint exercise in Tanzania, focussing on counter-terror military operations. Senior Colonel Zhang Xiaogang, spokesperson for China's Ministry of National Defence, said the exercise will be carried out on land and at sea and aims to enhance the participating troops' capabilities in joint counter-terrorism operations, and deepen military mutual trust and practical cooperation. Chinese troops had arrived in Tanzania by 27 July, allowing the opening ceremony to officially kick off the exercise on 29 July at the Comprehensive Training Centre (CTC) in Mapinga near Dar es Salaam. Sea drills will conclude on 5 August and land drills on the 11th. The Chinese forces in the Peace Unity 2024 exercise consist of two groups: ground units sent by the People's Liberation Army (PLA) Central Theatre Command and a naval flotilla sent by the PLA Southern Theatre Command. Kenya Reaffirms Commitment To Mediate Peace In South Sudan

Kenya has reiterated its dedication to mediating peace and stability in South Sudan, as President William Ruto met with the African Union's Panel of the Wise (PoW) at State House in Nairobi. The PoW, a consultative body of the African Union, consists of five appointed members tasked with advising the Peace and Security Council on conflict prevention and resolution. During the meeting, Ruto expressed optimism about the progress made in restoring stability in South Sudan ahead of its upcoming elections. "Kenya remains steadfast in the South Sudan journey towards the consolidation of peace and security. We are glad there has been demonstrable progress in bringing the country back to stability ahead of elections," he stated. He was joined by former Judge Effie Owuor, former Burundi President Domitien Ndayizeye, and Prime Cabinet Secretary Musalia Mudavadi. The ongoing instability in South Sudan, which erupted into civil war on December 15, 2013, has seen government forces clash with opposition groups, leading to widespread violence along ethnic lines.
