China, African countries to further strengthen ties with Global South: African expert

The Forum on China-Africa Cooperation (FOCAC) has elevated China-Africa development to new heights, and the 2024 summit, amid global anti-globalization trends, political instability, and retreating democracies, will further foster deeper cooperation as well as collaborative development among China, African countries and the Global South, Dennis Munene Mwaniki, executive director of the China-Africa Center at the Africa Policy Institute, told the Global Times. Mwaniki has high expectations for the upcoming summit. He said that it will enhance cooperation on agricultural technologies, advance the "green silk road" to support Africa in leveraging its rich green-energy resources to combat climate change, improve its health system through the "health silk road," and expand its global market access via the "digital silk road." China's trade with Africa hits 1.19 trl yuan

China's trade with Africa grew steadily in the first seven months of the year, rising 5.5 percent year on year to 1.19 trillion yuan (about 166.6 billion U.S. dollars), according to data released by the General Administration of Customs. China-Africa trade reached a record high of 282.1 billion U.S. dollars in 2023, up 1.5 percent year on year, showing strong resilience. In 2023, China's imports of African nuts, vegetables, flowers and fruits increased by 130 percent, 32 percent, 14 percent, and 7 percent, respectively, from the previous year. And China's new energy vehicles, lithium batteries, and photovoltaic products exported to Africa increased by 291 percent, 109 percent and 57 percent year on year, respectively. China has remained Africa's largest trading partner for 15 consecutive years, according to the customs. The GAC released the China-Africa Trade Index for the first time in 2023, with the general index of data from 2000 serving as the benchmark. Africa News.

Africa, China, and the Race for Critical Minerals: A New Focus for FOCAC?

Held every three years, alternating between Beijing and an African country as host, the summit is expected to draw a substantial number of African heads of state; 2018 summit in Beijing had over 50 African top leaders and representatives of African organizations in attendance. FOCAC summit to unfold a new chapter of China-Africa digital, tech cooperation

Fortunate Punungwe, a 20-something African radiographer, starts her daily work on Wednesdays by reviewing the patient list and making sure all the X-ray equipment is set up and working properly. Her work is mainly about using portable devices alongside artificial intelligence (AI) technology to spot tuberculosis (TB) patients in Zimbabwe, where over 40 percent estimated TB cases reportedly go undiagnosed. The African continent as a whole accounts for 23 percent of TB cases and 33 percent of deaths globally, according to an article published on WHO website. At the beginning of the year, Zimbabwe in collaboration with Chinese tech company Infervision, applied AI in larger scale in local community TB detection. Punungwe joined the program and received training at that time. According to her, the wide use of digital technology, especially AI, has been a "game-changer" for Zimbabwe, with far-reaching impact on the country's healthcare system. Global Times.

US taps Tanzania for infrastructure plan in battle with China for minerals

The US is roping Tanzania into the mooted Lobito Corridor project to tap the Kabanga nickel deposit, but with a wider focus on rivalry with China in areas where development will take place. The details emerged this week as Washington spoke of the importance of Tanzania in helping to link the corridor from the Atlantic to the Indian Ocean, making it easier for investments in natural resources lying in Angola, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Zambia and Tanzania. In Tanzania, however, Washington wants to tap into the country's minerals, particularly its nickel mines. Located in north-western Tanzania, some 120km south-west of Lake Victoria and near the border with Burundi, the Kabanga deposit is considered to be one of the largest and richest undeveloped nickel sulphide deposits known at present, of unrivalled scale and grade.
