By the end of Thursday, representatives from 408 companies, business associations and other institutions across 48 African countries had registered to attend the meeting, according to information released by the CCPIT. ## Avocados and honey imports a sign of China's growing agricultural engagement with Africa

Agricultural cooperation will be high on the agenda when Beijing hosts the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation Summit next week. South Africa is preparing to ship its first avocados to China and Tanzania has won a deal to export honey there as agriculture becomes a new focus of China-Africa engagement. The deals come as Beijing prepares to host the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation (FOCAC) Summit next week, with agricultural cooperation expected to be high on the agenda. Apart from avocados, China's food imports from Africa now include soybeans, pineapples, chillies, cashew nuts, sesame seeds and spices. The September 4-6 FOCAC Summit is expected to see African countries seek duty-free access to China for their products. In Beijing on Friday, Chinese foreign vice-minister Chen Xiaodong confirmed that "agricultural modernisation" would be part of the summit's four high-level meetings. South China Morning Post.

# China, Africa set to embrace closer economic, trade ties at FOCAC

Located 95 kilometers southeast of Addis Ababa, in the heart of the East African Rift, the Adama Wind Power Project stands tall with its impressive 80-meter-high white turbines. The project, built by Chinese companies, is a landmark in the partnership between China and African countries. Since they started operating in May 2015, the wind turbines have been a vital source of power for about 600,000 households. They have helped ease Ethiopia's power shortages, reduced the need for diesel generators and supported economic growth. Around 2,100 local jobs were created and several universities are involved in training and maintenance. This hands-on experience has prepared many for future roles in Ethiopia's wind energy sector. ### I want to share two Chinese features with my people: South African Ambassador to China

"Chinese culture, and Chinese people's hard work are the two features that I want to share with South Africans," said Siyabonga Cwele, the South African Ambassador to China, in an exclusive interview with China News Service in Beijing. Cwele has served as the Ambassador to China for more than three years and visited Zhejiang, Hubei, Hunan, Guizhou provinces, as well as Chongqing Municipality, etc. In his view, the bilateral relations between South Africa and China are continuously developing, with frequent exchanges and mutually beneficial cooperation maintained at a high level.
