

## China's new strategy in Africa: is the continent getting a fair deal?

China has unveiled a bold new strategy to deepen its influence in Africa – with mixed reactions over whether the continent will truly benefit. At the close of the latest China-Africa cooperation forum, Beijing presented an elaborate proposal to boost African development while securing its own strategic foothold. The Beijing Action Plan is China's blueprint for the next three years, committing a staggering €46 billion in aid, investments and credit lines. Building on the Dakar Action Plan – signed in the Senegalese capital in 2021 to strengthen cooperation in trade, infrastructure and development – the new deal promises African countries €27 billion in credit, €10 billion in assistance and €9 billion in direct investment from Chinese companies. # African nations see China as reliable partner

The pledge by President Xi Jinping to work with Africa to implement the 10-point partnership action plan to advance modernization has reaffirmed the country's commitment to Africa, according to experts. Xi made the pledge in his keynote speech at the 2024 Summit of the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation in Beijing on Thursday. The speech also depicted China as a reliable development partner for the continent, the experts said. Shakeel Ahmad Ramay, CEO of the Asian Institute of Eco-civilization Research and Development in Pakistan, called the speech a ray of hope for African people amid challenging times. He said that President Xi has proposed a way to assist Africa in solving the problems of poverty and food insecurity, improve healthcare, and pave the way for a peaceful, prosperous and future-oriented society. # Power-short Africa Finds 'Rafiki' in China

In July, I set foot on the African continent for the first time in my life. Before leaving, my mind was filled with memories of African overseas students experiencing power outages and Internet disconnections during my online or hybrid lectures. Therefore, I purchased a batch of portable solar charging devices before departure, just to be ready for potential emergencies. This precaution was not without reason. Out of 7.95 billion people in the world, 9 percent (around 685 million) of them lack access to electricity. Among them 570 million live in sub-Saharan Africa. Additionally, 2.1 billion people still rely on polluting fuels for cooking, leading to 3.2 million premature deaths annually. During my visit to Tanzanian regions such as Dar es Salaam, Morogoro, and Dodoma, I found Dar es Salaam's power supply generally reliable but capital Dodoma occasionally experienced power shortages. Though rapidly improving, basic rural electricity needs had not been fully met yet. Science and Technology Daily.

"The essence of Africa-China cooperation is mutual benefit and common development. Their cooperation has never been and will never be a mere talk shop," a former South African senior diplomat said. The Africa-China partnership is a mutually beneficial endeavor with huge potential for further growth, a former South African senior diplomat has said. Gert Grobler, a former South African ambassador to Spain, Japan, and Madagascar, and currently an honorary professor at the Institute of African Studies at Zhejiang Normal University in East China, made the comments during a recent interview with Xinhua. "The essence of Africa-China cooperation is mutual benefit and common development. Their cooperation has never been and will never be a mere talk shop," Grobler said. "While bringing tangible benefits to the African and Chinese peoples, Africa-China cooperation has also created more favorable conditions for international cooperation." Xinhua.

# China writes off more interest-free loans to Africa, but is the move just symbolic?

Beijing says other players such as the World Bank need to shoulder a much fairer share of resolving debt problems on the continent. China has announced another round of write-offs on interest-free loans to more than two dozen African countries, but observers say the relief addresses only a small fraction of the overall debt burden on those countries. At the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation (FOCAC) summit in the Chinese capital last week, Beijing said it would waive intergovernmental interest-free loans to 33 African countries due by the end of this year. Interest-free loan forgiveness is a regular feature of FOCAC. Two years ago, China announced it would forgive 23 loans that had matured in 2021 for 17 African countries. The loans are extended by the China International Development Cooperation Agency, Beijing's foreign aid agency. But they account for just a small fraction – about 5 per cent – of the total loans China has provided to African countries, according to observers. South China Morning Post.

## Closer ties with nation to lift African job market

China's new partnership actions for enhancing supply chain cooperation, foreign trade and connectivity with Africa will improve the continent's job market and modernization through infrastructure development and technology transfers, said business leaders and market watchers on Monday. In Beijing last week, China unveiled 10 partnership actions for modernization to deepen China-Africa cooperation over the next three years. The country will offer all least-developed countries that have diplomatic relations with China, including 33 countries in Africa, zero-tariff treatment for 100 percent of tariff lines, according to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. As for connectivity, China is ready to carry out 30 infrastructure connectivity projects in Africa. It will also expand market access for African agricultural products, and deepen cooperation with Africa in e-commerce and other areas. Experts said these initiatives aim to boost industrial capacity, foster sustainable growth and deepen trade relations between the two sides. China Daily.

# Africa News Tonight: Probe demand for Tanzania Chadema leader's death, Kenya mourns school fire victims, Africa eyes China-US competition

There are calls for a thorough investigation into the kidnapping and death of Ali Kibao, an official in Tanzania's opposition Chadema party, over the weekend. Kenya begins three days of national mourning Monday following the death of at least 21 students in a boarding school inferno in central Kenya, as officials search for at least 17 still missing from the blaze. The recent Forum on China-Africa Cooperation came as African leaders eye mounting great power competition between the United States and China over resources and influence on the continent, VOA Africa.
