

Stakeholders urge stronger Nigeria-China ties for economic growth, security

Stakeholders have called for a stronger Nigeria-China ties, emphasizing the importance of this partnership in fostering economic growth, regional security, cultural exchange, and global governance. Nation to help Africa advance green transition

A green development partnership proposed by President Xi Jinping has struck a chord with African nations, as it aligns with their urgent need to promote green transformation and presents an opportunity for them to leapfrog in the global value chain, experts said. The Partnership Action for Green Development is one of 10 partnership actions that the president proposed for modernization to deepen China-Africa cooperation and spearhead Global South modernization. "China is ready to launch 30 clean energy projects in Africa, put in place meteorological early warning systems, and carry out cooperation in disaster prevention, mitigation and relief as well as biodiversity conservation," Xi said when addressing the opening ceremony of the 2024 Summit of the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation earlier this month in Beijing. "We will create a China-Africa forum on the peaceful use of nuclear technology, establish together 30 joint laboratories, and collaborate on satellite remote sensing and lunar and deep-space exploration. All this is designed to help with green development in Africa," he added. China Daily.

China showcases Y-20 transport plane, other military exports at South Africa air show

Beijing is actively promoting sales of the Y-20, its flagship heavy-lifting aircraft that is used to move troops and equipment. China is demonstrating its Y-20 military transport aircraft at South Africa's largest air show to promote the heavy lifter and other military exports to Africa. The Y-20, a flagship multi-role transporter of the People's Liberation Army Air Force, will take to the sky and then be displayed during the five-day Africa Aerospace and Defence Exhibition (AAD 2024), the PLA Daily reported on Thursday. AAD 2024 is Africa's largest aerospace and defence expo, and is taking place from September 18 to 22 at Waterkloof airbase near Pretoria. Captain Liang Yao was quoted as saying that the Y-20, which weighs over 100 tonnes, would perform five "carefully choreographed manoeuvres" during a 10-minute demonstration for "optimal visual effects".

"We will strive to demonstrate the outstanding performance of the Y-20 and the excellent combat prowess of Chinese air force pilots," Liang told the PLA Daily. South China Morning Post.

The building will be located in Gitega, the political capital of Burundi, and China has agreed to equip it with all necessary facilities.
