What's really behind China's \$1bn renovation of the Tazara railway? On 4 September – on the sidelines of the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation in Beijing – Tanzania, Zambia and China signed an agreement to modernise the bi-national Tanzania Zambia Railway Authority – known as Tazara – which links the Southern Africa Regional transport network to Eastern Africa's seaport of Dar es Salaam. Railroads and Rivalries in Southern Africa

The U.S. and China plan to spend billions of dollars refurbishing key railway lines in southern Africa that link critical resource mining hubs in Zambia and the Democratic Republic of the Congo with ports on both sides of the continent. For the U.S., it's the Lobito Atlantic Railway that goes from the copper belt in Zambia 1,300km west across Angola to the Atlantic Ocean. However, China is looking in the other direction: proposing to spend upwards of a billion dollars to refurbish the TAZARA railway, which also begins in Zambia and heads almost 1,900km West to the Tanzanian port of Dar es Salam. "China is our strategic development partner, and it gives me great pride to see that during the 2024 FOCAC, our relations were elevated," Alupo said. China-Built Dam Commissioned in Uganda After Six-Year Delay

Uganda commissioned the Karuma Hydropower Station after a six-year delay blamed on vandalism of transmission lines and obstacles in land acquisition. Construction for the dam, which can generate 600 megawatts of electricity, started in 2013. President Yoweri Museveni attended the proceedings on Thursday. Exim Bank of China funded 85% of the \$1.7 billion project, according to Energy Minister Ruth Nankabirwa. The dam at Kiryandongo is more than 220 kilometers (137 miles) north of capital, Kampala. Uganda plans a massive boost to its electricity generation capacity by 2040 to spur economic growth. Hydro topped new capacity additions in Angola, Guinea, Mali, Nigeria and Uganda, which together added more than 1.3 gigawatt in 2023, according to BloombergNEF. BNN Bloomberg.

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
