Mines Minister Kizito Pakabomba revealed that the country plans to streamline customs and tax processes to attract new partners, News.Az reports, citing Bloomberg. The plan includes streamlining processes to pay customs and taxes, along with a partnership with the United Arab Emirates, he noted. The nation is also planning to revamp a railway that can be used to transport minerals so cargoes can be more easily exported from a port along the Atlantic Ocean, positioned closer to US and European markets, he said. The ambitions come as the country continues to play a key role in international metals markets, while also finding itself at the center of a contest between China, the US and other countries vying for access to critical minerals.
