Representatives from a dozen renowned Egyptian parties, such as the Homat Al Watan (the Protectors of the Nation) Party, the Free Egyptians Party, the Al-Wafd Party, the Egyptian Socialist Party, and the Justice Party, recently toured the China-Egypt TEDA Suez Economic and Trade Cooperation Zone in Ain Sokhna district of Suez province, where they visited a few Chinese factories, including those of Chinese home appliance manufacturer Midea and Chinese fiberglass giant Jushi. Algeria purchased and adopted Chinese WJ-700 drones

Algeria has purchased a high-altitude, long-endurance drone from the Chinese aerospace corporation CASIC. The deal was part of the country's strategy to diversify its arms suppliers, given the growing tensions in the region. The WJ-700 reconnaissance and strike UAV, which was first presented at the Airshow China in 2018, made its maiden flight in January 2021. The drone is designed to perform complex reconnaissance operations and deliver precision strikes over long distances. The WJ-700 has a low-slung wing, V-shaped tailplane and three-point landing gear. It is equipped with a turbojet engine and is capable of reaching a speed of about 700 km/h. The drone has a maximum take-off weight of 3,500 kg, a payload of over 800 kg, a flight duration of 20 hours, and a practical ceiling of 12 km. Gagadget.com.
