Is Algeria quietly acquiring Russia's Su-57 stealth fighter?

After the head of Rosoboronexport, Alexander Mikheev announced to Russian journalists on November 13 that a contract had been signed for the acquisition of the Su-57 Felon by a foreign operator, speculation began as to who the customer might be. Algeria is the most commonly mentioned potential buyer, with reports surfacing from Africa, Asia, and Europe. The X account Kad-Ghani claims Algeria is the first foreign operator of the Su-57, drawing a historical parallel to Algeria's acquisition of the MiG-25 years ago. "Algeria makes history again!
