

## African countries applaud China's zero-tariff treatment for least developed countries

Starting on Sunday, China will give all the least developed countries with which it has diplomatic relations zero-tariff treatment for 100 percent tariff lines, becoming the first major developing country and the first major economy to take such a significant measure. As observers have noted, the move meets the development needs of countries from the Global South, highlighting China's commitment to sharing development opportunities with nations worldwide through tangible actions. ### China has initiated a free-trade policy with 33 African countries

This initiative has reportedly been put into effect, as China is set to unilaterally allow zero-tariff market access for all products, to developing nations. Chinese state media reported that the East Asian country's zero-tariff policy for developing countries took effect on Sunday, as seen on Sputnik, "Africa is the continent with the largest number of least developed countries, and China's zero-tariff measure aims to drive industrial cooperation upgrading through large-scale trade, enhance China-Africa cooperation, and encourage more countries from the Global South to jointly pursue modernization," Yang Baorong, a researcher at the China-Africa Institute, told the Xinhua news agency. ### The Growing Militarization of China's Africa Policy

China's 2-week military exercises with Tanzania and Mozambique in July and August 2024 marked a significant expansion of People's Liberation Army (PLA) engagement in Africa. The battalion-sized Chinese deployment (approximately 1,000 troops) conducted land- and sea-based training involving maritime patrols, search and rescue, and live-fire drills with their Tanzanian and Mozambican counterparts in exercises labelled "Peace Unity-2024." Some two dozen different types of weapons and equipment, including small arms, heavy artillery, micro unmanned aerial vehicles, and various reconnaissance and infantry vehicles were involved. Biden's visit to oil-rich Angola seeks to underline an attempt by America to focus more on trade and heavy investment in infrastructure, in what some analysts see as the most direct counter yet to China's influence on the continent.
