Chinese fishing vessel under control of suspected pirates off Somali coast, EU naval force says

A Chinese fishing vessel off the coast of Somalia has come under the control of alleged pirates, a European Union anti-piracy force operating in the area said Thursday. The ship, with up to 18 crew members, had been taken over by the suspected pirates, some of whom were armed with AK-47s and machine guns, the European Union Naval Force Operation Atalanta said in a statement. It classified the incident as a robbery at sea and said none of the crew had been injured. The force had responded to an alert from police in Somalia's semi-autonomous northeastern Puntland region that a Chinese ship off the coast had allegedly been hijacked, its statement said. CNN.

Maritime threats high on agenda as Chinese navy hosts Gulf of Guinea security forum

China wrapped up a two-day forum on the security situation in the Gulf of Guinea on Thursday as it tries to boost its military presence in Africa, which analysts say would allow Beijing to "project power further west". The Chinese navy hosted the seminar in Shanghai, attended by the maritime armed forces of 18 countries from the Gulf of Guinea, including Cameroon, Congo, Gabon, Ivory Coast and Nigeria, according to a defence ministry statement. It said the marine environment and regional security would be on the agenda along with China-Africa maritime security cooperation. South China Morning Post.
