But now, Shenzhen-based Transsion Holdings is facing some stiff competition from rival Chinese brands. Transsion is the company behind phone brands including Tecno, iTel and Infinix, which won over African customers with features such as multi-SIM functionality and affordable price points. By 2021, Transsion's brands controlled half the continent's phone market share. But now brands including Xiaomi and Realme are eating into that share. South China Morning Post.

This will improve the Battery Energy Storage System, allowing excess energy produced during the day to be stored for nighttime use, according to Minister Robert Eklo.
