

China calls itself 'trustworthy, reliable friend' to South Africa amid US tensions

China has reassured South Africa that Beijing will remain a "trustworthy and reliable" friend and partner, offering assistance within its capacity, as tensions between Washington and Pretoria persist. Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi conveyed this message to South African President Cyril Ramaphosa during their meeting on the sidelines of the G20 foreign ministers' summit in Johannesburg on Thursday, where they discussed bilateral issues, according to the Chinese state-run CGTN. Digging Deep Into China's Zimbabwean Tobacco Business

Two decades ago, Zimbabwe's tobacco industry was in disarray. Once a global leader in tobacco production, yields collapsed following the adoption of a sweeping land reform policy in 2000, which broke up the country's large tobacco plantations into farms run communally or by smallholders. In 2008, the harvest produced less than 50 million kilograms, down from around 240 million kilograms a decade prior. Nearly 20 years on, that seems almost unimaginable. Production of Zimbabwe's flagship "golden leaf" tobacco hit a record 296 million kilograms in 2023, and the country's tobacco authority set a goal of producing 300 million kilograms during the upcoming 2024–2025 growing season. Chinese doctors to provide free surgeries for 600 cataract patients in Zimbabwe

A total of 600 cataract patients in Zimbabwe will receive free surgeries from Chinese doctors under the China-aided "Bright Journey" program. A team of 12 doctors from China's Hunan Provincial People's Hospital will perform the surgeries from Feb. 23 to March 1 in Harare, Zimbabwe's capital, Hong Xiuqin, the team leader, told Xinhua on Wednesday. Screening for eligible patients began on Feb. 12 and is currently underway, Hong said, adding that the Chinese medical team will cooperate with local doctors, provide on-site training, and engage in academic exchanges with Zimbabwean healthcare personnel.
