Tanzanian families regain time, dignity, health with China-built water project

As the world prepares to mark World Water Day on Saturday, observed annually on March 22 since 1993, more than 450,000 residents in the southern part of Tanzania's Dar es Salaam region are breathing a collective sigh of relief. For the first time, they have access to safe and clean running water. The Bangulo water supply project, located in the southern section of Dar es Salaam, was financed by the World Bank and implemented by Power Construction Corporation of China (PowerChina), a Chinese state-owned company known for its global infrastructure projects. China to upgrade historic Tanzania-Zambia railway with \$1.4 billion

China Civil Engineering Construction Corp (CCECC) will invest over \$1.4 billion to modernize a historic railway line connecting Zambia's copper mines to Tanzania's largest port. The railway, widely known as TAZARA, serves as a crucial route for copper exports from Central Africa and provides an alternative to bypass logistics bottlenecks in South Africa that have delayed copper and cobalt shipments. Negotiations for a 30-year concession are still underway, according to Bruno Ching'andu, managing director of the Tanzania-Zambia Railway Authority (TAZARA), which operates the line, Bloomberg reported. China exports internal combustion locomotives to Mozambique for the first time

Three internal combustion locomotives manufactured in China by CRRC Ziyang Co. and specially designed to meet operating conditions in Africa were officially shipped to Mozambique on 10 March. Developed independently by CRRC Ziyang Co., Ltd., a subsidiary of CRRC Corporation Limited. These units mark the first time that a Chinese company has supplied internal combustion locomotives to the Mozambican railway network. Madagascar Busts Ring Smuggling Brides Into China

Eight Chinese nationals have been arrested in Madagascar on transnational human trafficking charges, as local authorities in the African country dismantled a network that sold young Malagasy women to be brides in China, according to the Chinese embassy and local news reports. The case came to light after a Malagasy woman's family reported to authorities that she had been trafficked to China under the false understanding that she had to be married to a Chinese man in order to work and settle in China. Once she arrived in China, she was forbidden from going out or working and forced to bear children, the Madagascar Tribune reported on March 12. Caixin Global Limited.

Burkina Faso's junta inaugurates cement plant with Chinese support

Burkina Faso has inaugurated a new cement plant, Société Industrielle Sino Burkina de Ciments SA (CISINOB SA), in Laongo, Plateau-Central region. The facility, with a production capacity of 2,000 tonnes per day, is expected to create hundreds of jobs for the country's youth. The inauguration ceremony was led by Burkina Faso's interim military president, Captain Ibrahim Traoré, who described the plant as a testament to a mutually beneficial partnership between Burkina Faso and China. China's CCECC to invest \$1.4 billion in Tanzania-Zambia railway

The China Civil Engineering Construction Corporation (CCECC) will invest \$1.4 billion to upgrade the Tanzania-Zambia railway, the line's operator said on Thursday, improving a key route for copper exports from central Africa. The railway, widely known by its initials, TAZARA, also offers a way to bypass logistics bottlenecks in South Africa that have slowed copper and cobalt exports. "The decision to grant a concession follows an in-depth evaluation of TAZARA's challenges over the years, which necessitated urgent intervention," TAZARA Authority CEO Bruno Ching'andu said in a statement. China and Zambia ink deal on economic and technical cooperation
