Rebels in northern Mali went on to seize cities like Timbuktu, Gao and Kidal, declaring an independent Islamic State of Azawad and imposing sharia law. MSN.

The visa refusals come amid US President Donald Trump's administration's immigration crackdown and tightened border controls. DR Congo extends cobalt export ban by three months

DR Congo, the world's top cobalt supplier, imposed a four-month suspension on exports in February after prices had hit a nine-year low at just \$10 a pound. The ban was due to expire on Sunday. "The decision has been taken to extend the temporary suspension due to the continued high level of stock on the market," the Authority for the Regulation and Control of Strategic Mineral Substances' Markets (ARECOMS) said in a statement Saturday. Business Botswana relaunches China liaison office

Business Botswana (BB) has relaunched its China Representative Office (BB-CHINA) in a renewed push to strengthen trade and investment ties between Botswana and China. The announcement was made by BB president Neo Nwako during a high-level roundtable held alongside the 4th China-Africa Economic and Trade Expo in China's Hunan province. Nwako described the office as a "strategic hub" for commercial engagement, highlighting Botswana's investor-friendly environment and opportunities in renewable energy, agriculture, mining and digital innovation.
